Your team will take a scenic drive along **Cook Inlet's Turnagain Arm**, nestled between gorgeous mountain ranges and the unique bore tide that flows in and out of the Inlet. You'll experience Alaska's wildlife up close at the **Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center**, then hike along a river trail and ascend **Byron Glacier** in a gorgeous mountain basin. From there you'll go to **Virgin Falls** in the world's northernmost rainforest.

We highly recommend adding the optional **midweek recreation** - a trip to Eklutna Lake for mountain biking and sea kayaking on a pristine, glacier-fed lake with stunning alpine views.

If you wish to upgrade your **final day** recreation you may choose from a variety of three amazing glacier cruises or take an aerial tram in the Chugach Mountains.
